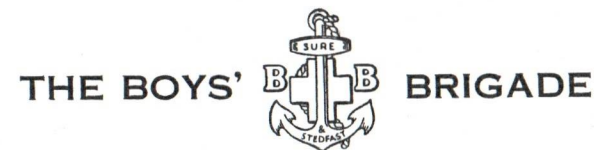

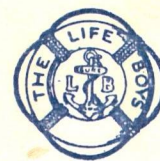
The Object of The Life Boys is The advancement of Christ's Kingdom among young Boys, and the training of a body of suitable Recruits for The Boys' Brigade.
