





Notes for Spectators To help your enjoyment

General

- **1** To gain entry to the Games Hall you must carry your programme. The Games Hall is open from 1000 hours.
- **2** Food and drink may not be consumed in the Sports Hall. The Gymnasium is available for the consumption of food and drink. Please help to keep the Premises tidy.
- **3** Games shall consist of two equal halves of 6 minutes. There will be a 3 minute changeover period to allow spectators to enter and leave the hall. NO ONE may enter or leave the hall whilst play is in progress.

The Game

1 If in the opinion of the referee a player commits an offence worthy of a yellow card he will be sent to The Sin Bin for a period of 3 minutes. If there is less than 3 minutes left in the current game the penalty will continue into the next game. Two yellow cards in a game does not necessarily mean an automatic sending off, this is at the discretion of the referee. If a player is shown a red card he will not play in the remainder of the Competition.

Technical Area

- 1 This is the area situated in the centre of the seated area housing the technical staff. The substitute and Sin Bin areas are situated there (See diagram page 9). During the competition no officer, coach, player or spectator may enter the area unless asked to report over the Public Address System.
- **2** Before each game commences the substitutes and one coach will report to the Technical Area and remain there for the duration of the game. Substitutions can be made at any time but must be notified to the fourth official before taking place. Substitutions must be made close to the Technical Area. A player goes on as the other comes off. Once substituted a player will not be allowed back on during the remainder of the game.

Spectators

Please refrain from putting your feet onto the field of play during matches. It is hoped that spectators will ensure a good atmosphere in the hall. Please feel free to chant and sing in support of your favourites but we would ask that you refrain from swearing, making racist or religious remarks or personal abuse. Any spectator acting in a manner detrimental to the image of The Brigade will be asked to leave.

Trophy Presentation

At the conclusion of the final. The National Trophy will be presented to the National Champions in the hall. Spectators are asked to remain in their seats until the conclusion of the presentation ceremony. Individual awards will be presented later at the Civic Reception.







FIVE-A-SIDE FOOTBALL



This is a fast and furious game with amazing skills performed at high speed. The duration of each game is twelve minutes (6 minutes each way). In the semi-final, third place play-off and final games, which finish as a draw at the end of normal time, play will be extended by six minutes (3 minutes each way). If no result after this period, play will continue until the first goal is scored - sudden death!

Heading of the ball is not allowed and the ball must be kept below head height (the Referee has discretion as to what constitues 'head height'). There is no offside and players can pass back to their goalkeeper. There are no goal kicks or corners just fast, flowing football!

GRAHAM BARNES: Graham Chairman of the Swindon & District Referee Association. Graham works as a Risk Improvement Engineer for the Zurich Insurance Company.

Only 3rd Gateshead and 70th London have won the Cup for the England and Wales Companies. The Irish, but mainly the Scottish Companies have dominated the competition.

Green Park



Buckingham Youth and Community Service welcomes the Boys' Brigade National Finalists to Green Park, the residential centre for young people in Buckinghamshire.

Green Park is located in the foothills of the Chilterns in an 80 acre woodland site. It was originally owned by the Rothschild family and is now the 'spiritual' home of voluntary and maintained youth service of the county. Particular emphasis is placed on the residential training of young people and those who work with them. The wide-ranging facilities at the Centre are in constant use by maintained and voluntary organisations, charities, and both central and local government departments.

We hope you have a very exciting stay and find the facilities for the needs of your National Finals.

BCVYS

BCVYS is an independent voluntary organisation, registered as a charity, working for the benefit of the county's young people.

Buckinghamshire Council for Voluntary Youth Services is the umbrella organisation for some 30 voluntary youth organisations, ranging from large national uniform groups to the small individual organisations in Buckinghamshire. Currently some 30,000 young people aged 5 to 25, backed by over 6,000 voluntary adult leaders, workers and supporters, are members of those 30 organisations.

BCVYS also works on behalf of the young people who do not belong to youth clubs or organisations.

Its aim is to enable voluntary youth organisations to retain their autonomy by sharing the best of good practice.

It offers the following services: Information; Training support; Grant allocation; Funding advice; Advocacy; Honest broker; Quality assurance.

The Boys' Brigade is a key member organisation within **BCVYS**.

Your Boys' Brigade battalion should be able to find its own local Council for Voluntary Youth Services (CVYS) within its local area and play an active part in affecting the work done with young people on your patch. The national umbrella group for voluntary youth work – NCVYS – (National Council for Voluntary Youth Services) gives support and encouragement to CVYS's across the whole country.

The Boys' Brigade nationally is also a member of NCVYS

Felden Lodge

Felden Lodge was bought by The Brigade soon after the 1939-45 war, to be the second of our national training centres.

Used heavily for training courses virtually every weekend, and in recent years mid week by parties from schools and local organisations, the grounds and buildings have been slowly but steady improved in recent years. The once almost derelict swimming pool has been converted to the Thurso Centre – self contained self catering accommodation popular with Company and Junior Sections looking for a weekend away. The one time tennis court is now a football training area with floodlights, with an adjacent sports hall well used during the week and on training courses providing accommodation in size not too different to that enjoyed by many a BB Company.

Then in the last few years the residential accommodation has been upgraded and now offers course members single and double rooms each with its own facilities. Soon after the All Final weekend work will start extending the dining room area.

For ten years Firm Foundations has been held here over the late May bank holiday weekend. One and a half thousand young people enjoying time together praising their Lord.

Still an important training centre Felden now houses the UK as well as the England & Wales HQ. These offices have now moved out of the old hall into the main house, and there are ideas on development of the hall. Better facilities for users of the camp site, and better storage and access to our archives (they also record the beginnings of youth work in the country) are all under consideration.


